The **County Line Old Time Music Jam** met on Sunday, November 1, 2009, at 2 PM CST, for its monthly gathering at Collierville’s **Sheffield Antiques Mall** (US 57 at US 72, behind O’Charley’s). The rain had subsided, and Mother Nature was displaying extraordinary fall colors. It was a great day to be outdoors—or in—listening to great music from more than a few years ago.

Old time music comes from the hills and hollers of the eastern United States, particularly the South. Our ancestors brought the music with them from Europe—Scotland, Ireland, England and Wales, in particular. How perfect it is to hold an old time music jam in the Sheffield Antiques mall, where we are surrounded by primitive collectibles and antiques of all sorts! The music is all-acoustic and the tunes tell of love, life, death, travel, and adventure...the stuff of life both then and now. Players are seated in a circle, with one person kicking off the session, followed by the next player to the right (or left). Instruments are nearly always those with strings, except for the bagpipes and tin whistles. The recent jam involved the following instruments: guitar, fiddle, mandolin, resophonic mandolin, dulcimer, autoharp, open-back banjo (played clawhammer or drop-thumb style), and the upright bass.
